SECTION AND STATE ITEMS

Sac Joaquin Section voting Items

Dead Period (Pg. 27-30) Isadore

This proposal adjusts the CIF SJS dead period, creating one universal dead period, and reorganizing the SJS limited and out-of-season periods. **VOTE YES** (VOTE YES ON ANTICIPATED AMENDMENTO

Spring Season of Sport {Pgs. 31-39} Isadore

This proposal adjusts the SJS Spring Season of Sport, moving the season back one week, ending the SJS spring sports season the weekend before Memorial Day weekend. **VOTE YES**

Proposed Post Season (Playoffs) Admissions Policy (Pg. 40) Isadore

Staff is presenting to the Board a proposal to increase the amount of money a school must pay for not having an admission gate for playoff contests. **VOTE YES**

Proposed Continued Success Movement - Spring Sports (Pg. 41) Isadore

This proposal recommends the movement of four (4) member schools up a division based on Section bylaw language for continued success in the spring sports of softball, boys tennis & boys volleyball **VOTE YES**

TVL Proposal - Baseball Rule Proposal (SJS Bylaw 1502.1) {Pgs. 42-45} Isadore

This proposal, submitted by the Trans Valley League, adds language to SJS Bylaw 1502.1, like softball, limiting sub-varsity baseball games to two (2) hours in length. **VOTE NO**

This proposal adjusts/increases the applied game suspensions for adult ejections (coaches & spectators).

Proposed Continued Success Movement - Fall Sports (Pg. 48) DeBoard

This proposal makes recommendations for the movement of schools up a division based on the Sections bylaw Language for continued success in the fall sports of football, girls tennis, girls volleyball, girls & boys water polo. **VOTE YES**

SJS Bylaw 503.6 Revision (Administrator-in-Charge) {Pg. 49} Lorenson

This bylaw revision recommends adding the following team sports to the list of team sports requiring an administrative presence for post season play (Girls Flag Football, Tennis, Wrestling-Team Duals, Lacrosse, CSC {Stunt}). **VOTE YES - Make motion to remove tennis from list.**

Sac-Joaquin Section Water Polo Regional Qualifiers (Pg. 50) Lorenson

This proposal recommends adjusting the Sections boys and girls water polo regional qualifiers (those teams advancing to regional water polo competition) **VOTE YES**

Foundation Games Proposal (Pg. 52) Feuerbach VOTE YES

This proposal recommends adjusting specific elements associated with conducting SJS approved foundation games as well as who can qualify for scholarships associated with the foundation games.

SJS President-Elect & Executive Committee Nominations {Pgs. 53-57} Garrison

The SJS Nominating Committee met by conference call, as per SJS Constitution - Article 4, Section 5 to nominate no less than two (2) individual candidates for President-Elect (see attached materials for names & resumes). Additional nominations will be accepted from the floor **VOTE YES**

State discussion Readings

CIF President-Elect and Executive Committee Nominations (Pgs. 58-60) Isadore

The CIF Nominating Committee met by conference call, as Per Bylaw 70.E., to nominate at least five (5) candidates for a two-year term on the CIF Executive Committee and at least two (2) candidates for PresidentElect. Additional nominations will also be accepted from the floor. **VOTE YES**

Bylaw 503.K.(1) - Heat Illness Protocol (Pgs. 61-66) Isadore

The Council will discuss proposed amendments to the bylaw which would require schools to postpone or cancel practices and/or competitions due to extreme heat. The changes to the heat illness protocol is due in part to the new requirements of California state law (AB 1653 - Sanchez). **VOTE YES**

Bylaw 503.K.(2) - Air Quality Index Protocol {Pgs. 67-68} Isadore

The Council will discuss proposed addition of this bylaw which would require schools to postpone or cancel

practices and/or competitions due to an unhealthy air quality level of 151 or higher. VOTE YES

Bylaw 503.L. - Emergency Action Plan and AED Protocols (Pgs. 69-70) Isadore

The Council will discuss proposed amendments to the bylaw which would require schools to review and rehearse their Emergency Action Plans due to the new requirements of California State Law (AB 245 - McKinnor). Other amendments related to requirements of the EAP and the location of an AED are detailed in the proposal **VOTE YES**

Bylaw 1803 Revision - State Traditional Competitive Cheer Championship Event Isadore

The Council will discuss the revision of this bylaw which would implement a state championship event in traditional competitive cheer in place of the current regional invitational events. This event would begin in the 2024-25 school year **VOTE YES**

Bylaw 3204 - State Boys Volleyball Championship Event {Pgs. 76-80} Isadore

The Council will discuss the addition of this Bylaw which would implement a state championship event in boys volleyball. This event would begin in the 2024-25 school year. **VOTE YES**
